







1. Thurgood Marshall was sworn in as the first Black Supreme Court Justice on \_\_\_\_\_. Please give the month, day and year of this historic event in our history.
2. She was a dedicated civil rights activist who publicly encouraged African-Americans to register to vote. She traveled to the Democratic convention in 1964 as part of the Mississippi Freedom Democratic Party. Testifying before the Credentials Committee, she described the treatment of African-Americans in her home state of Mississippi. She was instrumental in getting Congress to pass the 1965 voting rights bill that protected Black voters. In 1968, she was among the first Black delegates to the Democratic National Convention. Please name this dedicated civil rights activist.
3. He was born a slave on Christmas day, December 25, 1940 in Baltimore, Maryland. He was freed by the Emancipation Proclamation of 1863. At the age of 50, a turning point in his life came when he founded the Baltimore Afro-American newspaper. This turned into one of the largest Black newspapers in America and was operated and manned entirely by Black employees. The first issue of the Baltimore Afro-American Newspaper was August 1892. He served as the paper's editor until his death in 1922. He is known in the history books as \_\_\_\_\_.

## Keep clinging

When his wife received a stage-four cancer diagnosis, Mike Nappa was asked why he wasn't angry at God. His first answer: Anger is "beyond futile," as it can't change tough circumstances. His second answer was another question: "Why would I lash out in anger toward the only thing that brings me solace? That'd be akin to punching the lifeguard who's trying to save me from drowning."

"I must cling to Christ — desperately, determinedly, gratefully — for strength to see myself through every moment, both good and hurtful, both joyful and sorrowful," Nappa writes. "I've found Jesus to be more than sufficient. He is a man of sorrows who knows how to share mine and who tells me gently, in ways that I can believe, that in the end, everything is going to be OK. God is good; he is always good."
